As WIMS director, Dr. Townsend will continue to build on the outstanding groundwork already at OSUCOM and work collaboratively with faculty, administrative leaders and campus groups to advance the WIMS' mission to promote equity and advancement for faculty in College of Medicine by cultivating awareness, advocating for change and empowering women faculty to achieve personal and professional fulfillment. Dr. Townsend will lead WIMS to implement innovative programming, policies and initiatives that position Ohio State as a national leader in supporting women faculty in academic medicine and science, especially in the current climate of pandemic-related challenges.

Prior to joining Ohio State in 2020, Dr. Townsend held a Rising Tide Professorship at the University of Maine, where she founded the group Women in Science, Technology, Engineering, Mathematics and Medicine, a campus wide faculty advocacy group focused on the recruitment, career success, promotion, job satisfaction and retention of faculty identifying as women and other underrepresented groups in STEMM disciplines on campus.

The deadline for application submission opens in **mid-February**. This meeting is for women physicians and scientists with an appointment at an AAMC member school of medicine, with a minimum of two years of experience (from the date of the seminar) as an Assistant Professor. A CV is required for application and the application process is **open for only four week**, and will close once the applications exceed program capacity. We encourage you all to apply! WIMS has a budget of \$4000 that can be used to help offset some or all of your registration fees. 


