Basic structure for oral case presentations.

- a. Identifying information/chief complaint (ID/CC)
- b. History of present illness (HPI) including relevant ROS only
- c. Other active medical problems
- d. Medications/allergies/substance use (note:
- e. The complete ROS should not be presented in oral presentations
- f. Brief social history (current situation and major issues only)
- g. Physical examination (pertinent findings only)
- h. One line summary
- i. Assessment and plan

Next, review with students the relevant behaviors associated with the STAGE framework as listed in the Doccom module on oral presentations. Write out S-T-A-G-E on the board and have students describe the behaviors tied to each letter in the pneumonic:

- Tell the patient's <u>Story</u> using the organized format and use an engaging <u>Style</u>
- Confirm your <u>T</u>iming
- Identify your **Audience** and Setting then adjust accordingly
- Clarify the **Goals** of your presentation
- <u>Elicit</u> feedback
