Check the "Current Travel Warnings" issued by the U.S. Department of State to make sure that the country you are interested in going to is not listed.

- Choose an elective and apply to a program. The next step is initiating contact with the program or contact to find out how to apply (If you are going to an affiliated institution, you will work directly with the OGH). You will need a letter from the host institution/program to submit with the GHE application.
- The host site must be in a developing nation (lower, lower-middle, or upper-middle income). The World Bank provides a list of gualify-ing countries. data.worldbank.org/about/country-classifications
