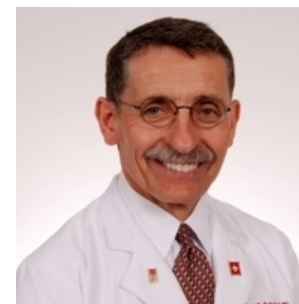

After nearly 40 years of dedicated service to the Department of Otolaryngology-Head and Neck Surgery, to The James Cancer Hospital and Solove Research Institute, and to The Ohio State University Wexner Medical Center, David E. Schuller, MD, Distinguished Professor, is retiring.

Dr. Schuller became a full-time faculty member at Ohio State in 1976 as an Assistant Professor in the Department of Otolaryngology. He served as Chairman from 1984-2005, and was instrumental in opening The Original Comprehensive Cancer Center, Arthur G. James Cancer Hospital and Richard J. Solove Research Institute, serving as its first director in 1988. This past year saw the opening of the new James Cancer Hospital and Solove Research Institute. Dr. Schuller served once again as the driving force.

In 1992, Dr. Schuller created the Department of Otolaryngology Alumni Symposium featuring the Saunders Lectureship with the intention of featuring and honoring department alumni and William H. Saunders, MD.

It is with immense gratitude that we bid him farewell and wish him all the best in his new adventures.



WILLIAM H. SAUNDERS, MD

William H. Saunders, MD, Professor, has been a member of the Department of Otolaryngology since 1954. He was Acting Chairman from 1961-1963, and Chairman from 1963-1984. He and his wife, Putzi, have accomplished much.

Dr. Saunders holds society memberships in The American Academy of Ophthalmology and Otolaryngology, the American Laryngological, Rhinological and Otological Society, and the American Laryngological Society among others. He has served as President of the American Board of Otolaryngology, and past Vice President of the American Board of Otolaryngology and American Laryngological Association.

Dr. Saunders has authored over 80 peer-reviewed journal publications, and has authored or edited five medical textbooks.

Chris Spielman



The Department of Otolaryngology-Head and Neck Surgery is pleased to welcome Chris Spielman as our 2015 guest speaker. Chris Spielman is an All-Star linebacker from Massillon Ohio. He was a 2 time All American for The Ohio State University Buckeyes. Chris played 11 years in the NFL for the Detroit Lions, Buffalo Bills, and the Cleveland Browns. He represented the Detroit Lions in four Pro Bowls and was named the team's defensive MVP in 1993 and 1994. Chris was inducted into the College Football Hall of Fame in 2009.

Currently, Chris is a College Football Analyst with ESPN, a Professional Speaker and his most important role besides being a father, is that of a Cancer Warrior – Chris continues the fight that he and his late wife Stefanie started together shortly after her first diagnosis of breast cancer. Over the years more the \$15.4 million has been raised for the Stefanie Spielman Fund for Breast Cancer Research and the Stefanie Spielman Patient Assistance Fund. He found his biggest opponent to be off the field. Chris' life has order: Faith, Family and Community – and he lives it daily in that order.

2015 SAUNDERS LECTURESHIP AWARD RECIPIENT

Michael M.E. Johns, MD



The Department of Otolaryngology-Head and Neck Surgery is pleased to welcome Michael M.E. Johns, MD, as the 23rd William H. Saunders Lecturer.

Dr. Johns is an internationally recognized head and neck cancer surgeon and leader in academic medicine.

His robust career includes serving as chancellor of Emory University, leading the Robert W. Woodruff Health Sciences Center, which includes Emory Healthcare, the schools of Medicine, Nursing and Public Health, and the Yerkes Primate Center, and serving as dean of the Johns Hopkins School of Medicine. Most recently, Dr. Johns served as interim executive vice president for Medical Affairs at the University of Michigan.

Dr. Johns is a member of the Institute of Medicine, the Association of American Medical Colleges, the Commonwealth Fund Task Force on Academic Health Centers, and the Association of Academic Health Centers, among others. He has served on various private-sector and philanthropic boards, including Johnson & Johnson, the Genuine Parts Company, and AMN Healthcare. He was recently appointed by the U.S. Secretary of Defense as a member of the Uniformed Services University of the Health Sciences (USU) Board of Regents.

Dr. Johns received his bachelor's degree at Wayne State University in his hometown of Detroit. He graduated with distinction from the University of Michigan Medical School in 1969 and remained at Michigan for his internship and residency. He joined the Medical Corps of the U.S. Army and was assistant chief of the Otolaryngology Service at Walter Reed Army Medical Center from 1975 to 1977. In 1977, he joined the Department of Otolaryngology and Maxillofacial Surgery at the University of Virginia Medical Center, where he rose to the rank of Professor. In 1984, Dr. Johns was recruited to Johns Hopkins as professor and chair of Otolaryngology-Head and Neck Surgery, a department he built into one of the country's largest and most prestigious.

L. Arick Forrest, MD



The Department of Otolaryngology-Head and Neck Surgery is pleased to welcome L. Arick Forrest, MD, as the 11th David R. Kelly, MD, Lecturer in Medical Economics. Dr. Forrest is the Director of Ambulatory Services for The Ohio State University Wexner Medical Center and serves as the Director of The Ohio State University Voice and Swallowing Disorders Clinic.

Dr. Forrest obtained his medical degree from The Ohio State University in 1988 and his MBA from The Ohio State University Fisher College of Business in 2010. He completed Residency training at The Ohio State University in 1993 and then was awarded a Laryngology Fellowship at Vanderbilt University in Nashville, Tennessee. The fellowship was under the guidance of Robert H. Ossoff, DMD, MD, and was a focus on voice disorders and treating the professional voice. After the Laryngology fellowship Dr. Forrest completed a second fellowship in Microvascular and Reconstructive Surgery at The Ohio State University under the guidance of Michael Sullivan, MD. His area of interest for the reconstructive training was in post head and neck cancer reconstruction.

Dr. Forrest, along with Dr. Michael Trudeau, PhD, established the Voice & Swallowing Disorders Clinic at OSU in 1994.
