History of Present Illness			
Brief identifying statement that includes the patient's age, reason for encounter and presenting complaint/concerns			
Conveys the presentation as a chronological story			
Includes pertinent positive and negative symptoms/features			
Physical Exam			
Includes vital signs and general appearance			
Describes abnormal findings and pertinent elements of physical examination			
Laboratory Data			
Presents pertinent lab results/studies in an understandable way-if applicable			
Assessment			
Includes pertinent assessment for primary problem (differential diagnosis or status of chronic problem)			
Provides prioritization and rationale or evidence for differential diagnosis or other reasoning, if applicable			
Plan			
Includes diagnostic plans- if applicable			
Includes therapeutic plans			
Style			
Appropriate length for the situation			
Appropriate pace and vocal level			
Uses respectful and compassionate language toward all (patient, family, healthcare team members)
