CancerGene (CaGene6)

This suite that includes BRCAPRO, MMRpro, PancPRO, and MelaPRO, calculates gene mutation probabilities. CancerGene is available on all machines in the graduate student rooms, and available for download onto other CCC computers by calling the Help Desk.

Health Sciences Library

The [Prior Health Sciences Library](#) provides multiple digital research resources, including several databases, eBooks and eJournals, and [citation management tools](#) like RefWorks and EndNote.

Help Desk/IT

OSU's main resource for assistance with University-based accounts, as well as technology infrastructure issues, is the Help Desk. They can be reached by calling (614) 293-4357 or through their [online Self Service option](#). Some account issues may require assistance from the GCGP Program Coordinator.

Landmark Transcription Service

The Genetic Counseling Graduate Program has an annually renewed contract with [Landmark Associates Inc.](#) To use this service, students must first obtain approval from someone on the OSU-GCGP Leadership Team. There is a fee to use Landmark, so any usage fees will be deducted from the student's research stipend/grant funding.

COM Mobile Services

NVivo

Select computers in the GCGP student computer lab are equipped with NVivo, a tool that allows fine-detail analysis, fluid exploration and interpretation, and the integration of processes of interpretation and questioning in Qualitative Data Analysis. Computers with this install have an "NVivo" sticker on the side of the tower unit, and are for shared use.

OCIO

The Office of the Chief Information Officer (OCIO) is the approver of all software allowable for download and use on University owned computers. You can find a list of approved software [on their website](#). All downloads onto University equipment must go through the Program Coordinator.

Tech Hub

The [OSU Tech Hub](#) is the official technology store of the University and offers discounted hardware and software to all students and employees. It also offers support and training services on products purchased through this outlet.

Typhon

The GCGP uses the tracking system Typhon to administer and record student's clinical work information like case logs and evaluations. Clinical supervisors/preceptors and students have their own account log-ins to complete and approve assigned tasks.

Zotero

Zotero is a free and open-source reference management software to manage bibliographic data and related research materials such as PDF files. Notable features include web browser integration, online syncing, generation of in-text citations, footnotes and bibliographies, as well as integration with multiple word processors. It is produced by the Center for History and New Media at George Mason University, and is available for download at <https://www.zotero.org/>.
