*Direct Cost

The Cost of Attendance (COA) provided is an estimate of all cost associated with attending OSUCOM each year (summer – spring). It includes average values of direct and indirect cost.

Direct Cost – Items that will appear on a student’s bill and must be paid to the university.

Indirect Cost – Items not billed but reasonable estimates provided for planning purposes.

The COA is a student’s financial aid limit for scholarships, grants, & loans and should serve as the basis of their personal budget. Some additional expenses and fees, like OSU Insurance or childcare, can be added to the COA to increase financial aid eligibility. Students should contact our office if considering enrolling less than full-time any semester to discuss impacts to COA and financial aid.
