Hamilton Hall and the Interdisciplinary Health Sciences Center 1645 Neil Ave.

Hamilton Hall was completely upgraded in 2024, connecting 120,000-square-feet of renovated spaces with a new 100,000-square-foot building now known as the Interdisciplinary Health Sciences Center.

Home to the College of Medicine and other flexible spaces to serve multiple Health Science colleges, the Interdisciplinary Health Sciences Center strengthens Ohio State's interprofessional education opportunities and curriculum across the colleges of medicine, dentistry, nursing, optometry, pharmacy, public health and veterinary medicine.

Hamilton Hall is where medical students learn human anatomy in the Human Gross Anatomy laboratories. Course content focuses on clinical cross-sectional anatomy essential to interpreting MRIs and other diagnostic imaging technologies. The building also houses research laboratories, classrooms, the Department of Pathology and the Department of Physiology and Cell Biology.

Brain and Spine Hospital 300 W. 10th Ave.

The Ohio State University Brain and Spine Hospital is home to central Ohio's top-ranked Neurology/Neurosurgery program. The 87-bed, 60,000-square-foot Brain and Spine Hospital combines the talent and resources of doctors and researchers at Ohio State's Neurological Institute in one comprehensive hospital. It includes specialized units for stroke care, neurotrauma and traumatic brain injuries, spinal cord injuries and spine surgery, epilepsy, chronic pain, acute rehabilitation and neurosurgery.

Rhodes Hall (University Hospital) | 450 W. 10th Ave.

Located just west of the Brain and Spine Hospital is Rhodes Hall, or University Hospital, one of the many sites where you'll have a chance to work with patients in a clinical setting. With more than 900 beds, University Hospital specializes in critical care, organ transplantation, women's health, digestive diseases, minimally invasive surgery, rehabilitation and neuroscience. University Hospital is designated as a Level I trauma center by the American College of Surgeons, a national accrediting body.

Dorothy M. Davis Heart and Lung Research Institute

473 W. 12th Ave.

With a dedicated building and other spaces across the Ohio State campus, the Ohio State Davis Heart and Lung Research Institute is one of the most advanced interdisciplinary facilities on campus. Staff and trainees from multiple disciplines are dedicated to discovering diagnostics and treatments for patients with acute and chronic diseases that affect the heart and lungs. The Institute also includes research teams that investigate diabetes and kidney disease, transplantation medicine, medicine, stroke, skeletal muscle disorders, neurological diseases, immune defects and regenerative medicine.

Biomedical Research Tower (BRT) | 460 W. 12th Ave.

The BRT is a 10-story facility containing dedicated research space designed in open-lab layouts to promote interdisciplinary interaction. The largest research facility on the Ohio State campus, the BRT is a critical hub for Ohio State's internationally recognized research programs in cancer and cancer genetics, cardiovascular and lung disease, and high-field imaging. It also expands programs in such important fields as biomedical informatics, neurological disorders, pharmacogenetics, targeted molecular therapies, microbial pathogenesis and biodefense, and tissue engineering.

Inpatient Tower

460 W. Ninth Ave.

Scheduled to open in early 2026, the inpatient hospital will provide leading-edge research, outstanding clinical training and world-class patient care. The 1.9 million-square-foot inpatient hospital will have up to 820 beds in private-room settings to elevate patient-centered care, safety and education for the next generation of health care providers.

The Ohio State University Comprehensive Cancer Center – Arthur G. James Cancer Hospital and Richard J. Solove Research Institute
460 W. Ninth Ave.

Ohio State Comprehensive Cancer Center – James Cancer Hospital and Solove Research Institute is one of the nation's premier centers for the prevention, detection and treatment of cancer. It features one of the world's most advanced cancer hospitals, which incorporates patient care, teaching and research space on all floors. The OSUCCC – James is one of the National Cancer Institute's highest-rated cancer centers and a founding member of the National Comprehensive Cancer Network, which develops clinical practice guidelines for cancer care worldwide.

Richard M. Ross Heart Hospital
452 W. 10th Ave.

Celebrating its 20th anniversary in 2024, Ohio State's Ross Heart Hospital is a 150-bed facility that combines the latest technology with patient-focused care. It's also central Ohio's only adult heart hospital ranked among the nation's best by *U.S. News & World Report*. Each floor is dedicated to a specific service, such as cardiac surgery or vascular medicine. Patient rooms are designed to be adaptable, allowing most patients to stay in the same private room throughout their hospitalization.

Prior Hall/Health Sciences Library
376 W. 10th Ave.

The Health Sciences Library located in Prior Hall is the place to find reference material, including print and electronic collections, and services that include expert guidance and consultative support from librarians, event technology, anatomical models and medical illustration services, and others. Prior Hall is also home to Ohio State's Clinical Skills Education and Assessment Center, where health sciences students and trainees from across campus and the medical community learn and practice procedural skills on technologically advanced simulation equipment in a safe and secure environment. Prior Hall contains virtual critical care bays with observation and control stations, a surgery laboratory, technical lab/debriefing rooms, an ultrasound room and a 70-seat seminar room.

The third floor of Prior Hall was completely remodeled in 2020 as a modern 24/7 dedicated study space for medical students. This includes space for individual quiet study, group study and meditation.

Starling Loving Hall
320 W. 10th Ave.

This structure was opened and dedicated in 1917 as the Homeopathic Hospital. Ohio State's Board of Trustees changed the name in 1921 to Lynne Starling Hospital and in 1923 to Starling Loving University Hospital. It was expanded in several renovations over the years and served as the university's hospital until its clinical medical facilities were moved to the nearby and newly constructed University Hospital in 1951. The older building officially became Starling Loving Hall in 1961.

Graves Hall
333 W. 10th Ave.

Graves Hall is where students will find additional classrooms, study areas, a medical student lounge, research labs and the Graves Hall vivarium. Home to offices from several academic programs in biomedical research, Graves Hall also houses the Department of Neuroscience.

Meiling Hall
370 W. Ninth Ave.

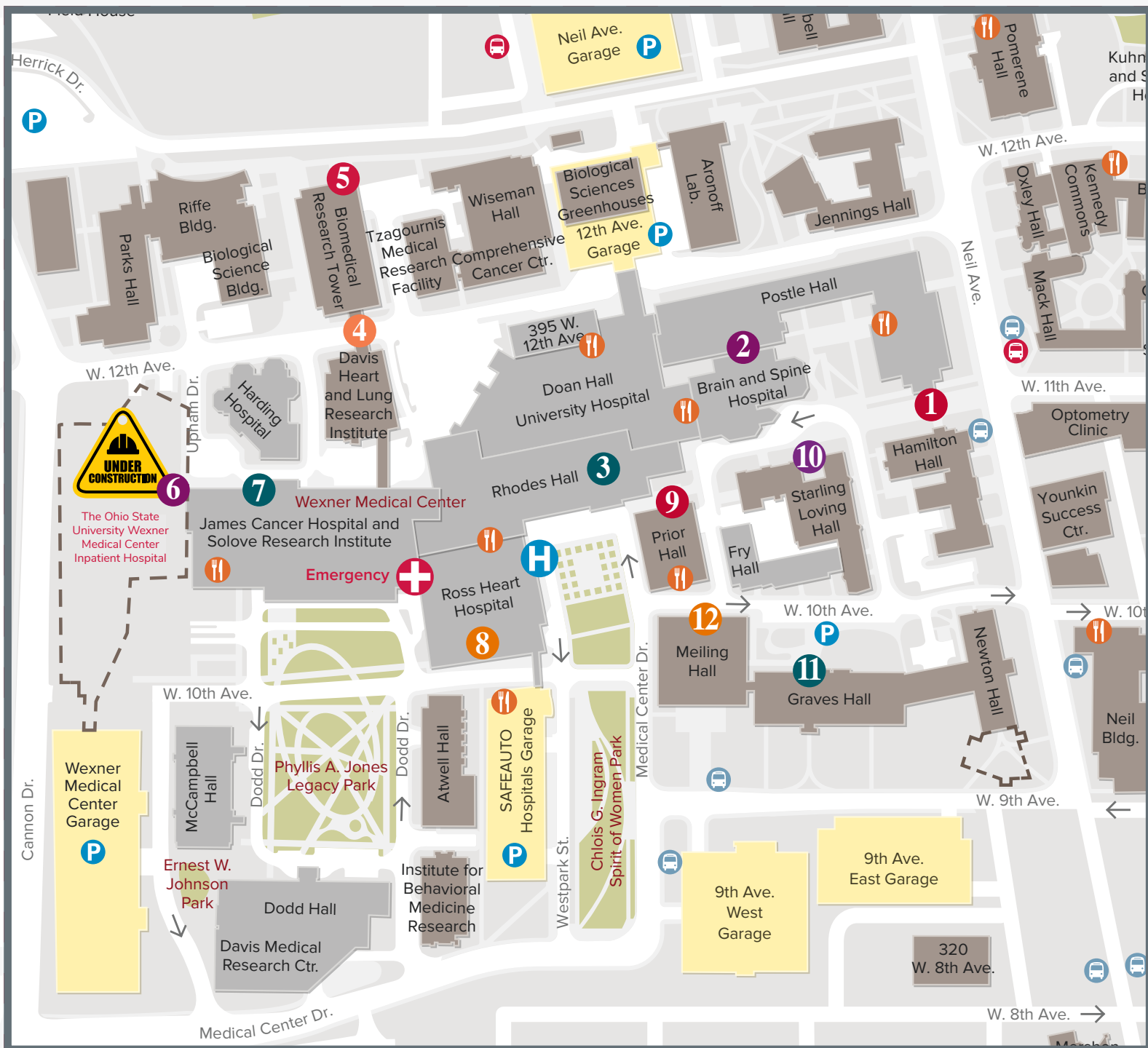
Connected to Graves Hall to the west, Meiling Hall is the former home of the College of Medicine. It still houses lecture halls, conference rooms, study and vending areas, and a workout room. The building remains a friendly place for students to learn, relax and mingle with colleagues. Two large lecture halls (112 and 160) are also located on Meiling Hall's first-floor main lobby.
