Item 1: Approval Meeting Minutes

Discussion/Action

- 1. The minutes from the January meeting were reviewed and approved with the following revision:
 - a. Add Dave Way to the attendance roster

Item 2: Old Business/Announcements

- 1. HSIQ Part 3 student posters will be presented at the Patient Safety Fair on 3/15/17. The first session will be from 9a-10a and the second session from 10a-11a.
- 2. Michael Barrie will be replacing Laura Thompson as the Associate Director for AMHBC Emergency Medicine.
- 3. "Getting Started in Canvas Workshop" will be held Wednesday, March 1, 2017 from 9:30-11:00am in 460B Prior HSL.
- 4. 2017 Spring Symposium:
 - a. Please join the College of Medicine and the Office of Graduate Medical Education for the annual Spring Symposium, taking place Tuesday, May 16

from 7:30 a.m. to 4:30 p.m. in Meiling and Graves halls. The focus for this year's event will be Graduate Medical Education; all educators across the health sciences are welcome to attend. The day will feature two plenary speakers, Timothy Brigham, MDiv, PhD, chief of staff and senior vicepresident for the Department of Education at the ACGME, and Karen Warburton, MD, director of Graduate Medical Education Professional Development in the Department of Medicine at the University of Virginia.

- 5. SPE Report: N. Verbeck discussed the results of the 2015 Graduate and Program Directors Surveys.
 - a. New questions added in 2016 to more directly address ACGME competencies

- b. Student skills have maintained strong ratings (average of 4 or above on most items) with slight increase in interpersonal skills ratings.
- c. 98.7% of OSU graduates feel they are equally if not better prepared for residency when compared to peers from other institutions.
- d. 96.2% of directors feel that OSU graduates are equally if not better prepared for residency when compared to graduates from other institutions.
- 6. **Discussion Item:** Self Care in 4th Year: LCME is focusing on Wellness, Stress, Resiliency and Burn Out and where it is taught. Dr. Lynn sent out an article on Fatigue and Sleep in Neurology Residents.
 - a. Part 1 covers these topics frequently.
 - b. The Advanced Communication activity in the Part 3 Mini Internship addresses wellness.
 - c. AMRCC has a reflection activity which is reviewed at the mid-month meetings.
 - d. Discussion about creating an articulate for sleep fatigue.
 - e. N. Kman suggested putting together a task force. Ashley Fernandes reached out to Dr. Splaingard at Nationwide Children's who gave a Grand Rounds on this topic. Dr. Splaingard will be doing an articulate module to accompany the article on Fatigue and Wellness Session.
- 7. RIME 2018: The AAMC Research in Medical Education (RIME) Program Selection Committee invites you to consider preparing your current research in medical education for submission to RIME for 2018.

The Committee is looking for innovative studies and reviews on a wide range of topics including (but not limited to) new insights into curriculum design and assessment, supporting the needs of medical learners at all levels, and understanding diversity in our learners and learning environments.

The call for RIME submissions will take place in October 2017 with submissions due in December 2017, but the time to begin planning is now.

Some perks of submitting to RIME include:

- A very fast peer-review cycle;
- An opportunity to present at Learn, Serve, Lead, 2018 in Austin TX if your work is accepted;
- Publication in the RIME supplement to Academic Medicine (now available in open access).

Eligibility for national-level competitive awards.

For an in-depth look at what RIME is seeking, and to help guide your manuscript preparation, please read Characteristics of RIME Papers the Make the Cut. This 2016 foreword to the RIME supplement is a wealth of good advice.

Item 4: Professionalism Standards Committee

Discussion regarding how to identify a competency not met in professionalism. It was suggested to create a work group to identify minimum standards and guidelines for Professionalism Competencies.

- a. Have members from all 3 parts of the curriculum
- b. John Mahan, Director of Professionalism Competency, would head the committee
- c. Include students from the Honors and Professionalism council
- d. Include other key staff and faculty (i.e. E & A, etc.)

Item 5: Showcase Portfolio Scoring

- C. Bardales reviewed the scoring rubric and the criteria for grade designation.
 - 1. Students will be assigned an overall Showcase Portfolio Part 3 unit grade that is a calculation of the aggregate numerical score provided by the faculty assessors.
 - a. Total possible points are 100 using a rubric consisting of 5 independently scored, behaviorally anchored items.
 - b. Passing criteria is obtaining a total aggregate score of 70.00
 - c. The weight of the total score is 5% of the overall Part 3 score. The committee agreed to adopt the rubric for the next academic year.

Item 1: Approval Meeting Minutes

Discussion/Action

a. The minutes from the February meeting were reviewed and approved

Item 2: Old Business/Announcements

- On April 29, 2017 The Wexner Medical Center at The Ohio State University will be hosting the 6th annual Primary Care Career Day for the entire state of Ohio. There are no fees for medical students, residents or mentors for this conference. The day will include a light breakfast and lunch as we discuss hot topics, careers, and scholarly activity in Primary Care.
- 2. Congratulations to Keri Nuesmeyer who will be moving on from the College of Medicine to the Medical Center. Thanks for your hard work.
- 3. End of Part 3 Survey will be going out today and will be closed near graduation. V. Cannon mentioned this is a great asset to get feedback, both positive and negative

- and asked the student representatives to encourage their classmates to complete the survey.
- 4. L. Volk reported that Part 3 Scheduling is going very well and the last competitive round will open March 24th where students will complete most of their schedule and register for clinical tracks.
- 5. The interview survey conducted by the students will be presented at the April meeting and will assist faculty with advising the students.
- 6. L. Hurtubise mentioned that the proposals for The Generalists in Medical Education are open. http://www.thegeneralists.org/conference/callforproposals.

Item 4: Advanced Competency / Elective Review

- 1. A. Grieco presented the proposed Advanced Competency in LGBT Health.
 - a. The AC in LGBT Health has been built upon the OSU undergraduate course entitled "LGBT Health" (MedColl 4208), initially offered during the spring of 2017. The AC in LGBT Health will support student participants in attaining advanced competence in communication, and its critical applications, for a specific patient population facing a range of disparities in health care and its provision. Numerous specific areas of application will be explored, but in fulfillment of the mission of the AC, the experiences will provide benefit regardless of the intended specialty and form of practice.
 - b. Course Directors are John Davis and Alex Grieco.
 - c. Activities will consist of a Mid-term, OSCE and a Final exam.
 - d. Students planning on a Global Health elective or have AMHBC or AMRCC during that time may not be able to participate.

Action: The proposal was unanimously approved by the committee.

- 2. J. McCallister reviewed the proposed Advanced Competency in Research Planning.
 - a. Designed to meet the needs of MSTP students in understanding the clinical relevance of scientific inquiry and demonstrate the ability to evaluate emerging knowledge and research as it applies to diagnosis, treatment and the prevention of disease. This is a longitudinal course.
 - i. Students would identify a mentor and project during their Part 2 year. ii. Data collection and analysis would be completed during Part 3.
 - b. The total time is 300 hours and will count for 2 credits (1 AC and 1 elective in Part 3).
 - c. Clarification will need to be made regarding the need to register for additional credit hours.

Action: The proposal was unanimously approved by the committee.

3. The elective proposal for Arriving at Accurate Assessments is tabled until next month so the AC/AE Committee can review.

Item 5: AMRCC Year-End Review

Ashley Fernandes presented a review of AMRCC for the 2016-2017 academic year.

- 1. The title "Interdisciplinary" has been changed to "Interprofessional" to keep in line with the Interprofessional team care model.
- 2. AMRCC Statistics:
 - a. has approximately 52 clinical sites (30 ambulatory, 22 chronic care)
 - b. there were 27 longitudinal students for 2016-2017
 - c. 101 students had completed both components of AMRCC by January 2017

- d. 4 students failed the final exam twice, resulting in oral remediation
- e. 12 students have received Honors and 7 received Letters thus far
- f. 89% rated the overall quality of the course very good or excellent
- g. 78% said it was well organized
- h. 85% said it was well integrated with LSI
- i. 93% agreed or strongly agreed with clinical relevance
- j. 805 agreed or strongly agreed with the correlation to Foundational Sciences
- k. 94% agreed or strongly agreed AMRCC promoted professionalism
- 3. TBL: IPV, CM, Toxic Stress: Social Work Pilot Results
 - a. 6 medical students and 6 social work graduate students participated in the pilot in January 2017
 - b. Course was highly rated by both sets of students
 - c. This TBL will be offered in 2017-2018 during orientation each block
- 4. There were several scholarship opportunities completed:
 - a. "Using Interprofessional Team-Based Learning to Teach About Child Maltreatment and Toxic Stress," to be submitted to the AAP national conference, Chicago, IL, Sept. 2017, Ashley K. Fernandes, MD, PhD with coauthors

 - b.  The College of Medicine is offering two MERC sessions for free to College of Medicine faculty; sessions normally costs \$50 per person. Scholarly Writing: In this session, the skills of scholarly writing will be explored through the lens of analyzing a manuscript that was accepted for publication. Searching and Evaluating the Medical Education Literature: This workshop is intended for individuals, medical educators, and clinician educators who want to learn how to effectively search the published medical education literature and to evaluate the value of those searches. *This session will be held on Wednesday, October 26th from 9:00am to 12:00pm in 1069 Graves.*
