Direct costs \$4,881,771, total costs \$5,603,415

Gay, lesbian, and bisexual people face significantly greater risk for chronic health conditions than heterosexual adults. The biological underpinnings of these group differences have been minimally studied representing an important gap in knowledge. This study offers the unique opportunity to examine psychosocial stressors, inflammation, and epigenetic aging in a large, US population representative sample with sexual minority and heterosexual adults.

**The National Couples Health and Time Use Stress Biology Study (NCHAT-BIO):
Biobehavioral Pathways to Population Health Disparities in Sexual Minorities**

Direct costs \$346,081, total costs \$463,502

Sexual minorities (e.g., gay, lesbian, and bisexual adults) have significantly greater risk for obesity, asthma, diabetes, cardiovascular disease, and some cancers compared to heterosexuals. However, both biomarkers of risk and modifiable behavioral and psychological factors contributing to these health disparities are unknown. This study capitalizes on an unprecedented opportunity to study biobehavioral health among sexual minorities *and* intersectional effects of racial minority status on health via the examination of inflammatory markers and viral latency via biological sample collection from participants of NCHAT, the first population-representative, racially/ethnically diverse, multi-method, fully-powered study of cohabiting and married sexual and gender minorities, with a comparison sample of heterosexuals.

Renewed for another five years by NICHD, the National Couples' Health and Time Study (NCHAT) includes 5,157 US adults ≥ 18 years of age, with oversamples of Black, Latinx, and Asian individuals. With 2,230 (43.2%) identifying as gay, lesbian, bisexual, or other identifies, NCHAT is the only population-representative study with a fully-powered subsample of sexual minorities in the US. Via recent R2I funding, we are currently examining inflammatory markers and viral monitoring in a subset of this study sample. The current award will permit for examination of epigenetic clocks among a subset of individuals in a study of This pilot award will support a future R0I applications addressing longitudinal changes in stress biology in the renewed NCHAT cohort.
